The [S.H.E Leadership event](#) will invite young people aged 12-17 who identify as “female” to join us for a live exciting event featuring keynote speakers, entertainers, celebrity role models, interactive workshops, games and activities.


The program was developed to engage a demographic that has historically reported higher rate of depression, psychological distress, and anxiety disorders than males of the same age.

Among the goals of this project, we aim to create a community of support and encouragement among adolescent females, a population that shows a drastic decrease in self confidence as they reach their adolescent years.

The program seeks to benefit all those who identify as female. We invite youth of all backgrounds and experiences, including transgender, native and immigrant populations, to participate and enhance this event. The event encourages participants to overcome the challenges faced by females and to celebrate their she-hood by sharing stories of female success, creating a model for peer support, and ultimately supporting the development of skills that will help young females achieve their goals.

The [S.H.E Leadership event](#) coincides with the UN's 4th annual "International Day of the Girl Child" and is set to be piloted in Fall 2016.
